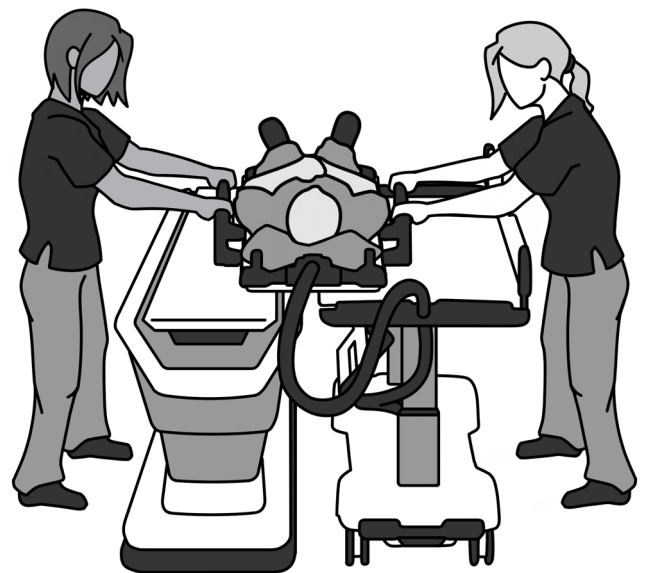
## Without Symphony
